SUMMARY OF PARISH COUNCILMEETING ON WEDNESDAY 8TH OCTOBER 2025

Below is a summary of some of the planning discussions that took place at the Parish Council meeting held in October.

Report by District / County Councillors

County Councillor Edwards had given her apologies and submitted her report. Here is an extract from the report.

Chalgrove Airfield Proposed Development

There's been a lot of discussion about the proposed housing development at Chalgrove airfield recently. I asked for a briefing with Oxfordshire County Council's (OCC) planning team and went with Freddie van Mierlo, MP and Cllr David Turner (South Oxfordshire District Council ((SODC)), Chalgrove ward) to meet the leadership team at Martin-Baker Ltd to understand their perspective. My key takeaways from this learning are:

Martin-Baker Ltd are clear that there is no viable alternative site for their operations, and they could not easily transfer the tests that they do elsewhere. The firm is crucial to the safety of air force jets around the world, and their systems have saved hundreds of lives over the years. They genuinely do not have a "Plan B" and are planning to fight not only the planning application but also any compulsory purchase order. Freddie van Mierlo MP has secured the promise of a meeting with the Secretary of State for Defence to discuss the security implications of putting this important British company at risk.

Homes England is now clearly preparing to submit a planning application to SODC in the next few weeks and are inviting residents to a public consultation event in Chalgrove at the John Hampden Hall between 2:30 and 7pm on 22nd October. Cllrs van der Merwe and Harrison will attend the event.

Planning

P25/S2724/HH - The Thatched House, High Street, Little Milton, OX44 7PU

Demolition of existing single storey rear extension and erection of a new single storey extension. Resolved to Fully Support the application.

P25/S1653/FUL - Haseley Trading Estate {Post meeting note}

South Oxfordshire District Council (SODC) Planning Committee met on 8th October to consider the application to convert the old Countax site at Great Haseley Trading Estate to a park and ride hub for the districts' bin lorries.

Little Milton, Great Milton and Great Haseley had the opportunity to voice our deep concerns with this application – for Little Milton these focussed on the traffic impact of routing all bin lorries through our village, as well as on the impact to the pumping station on the Haseley Road of adding the substantial amount of water that will arise from daily washing of 50 bin lorries.

Our District Councillor Georgina Heritage and MP Freddie van Mierlo joined the meeting, and both spoke up to strongly support our points. However, despite this SODC, as expected, approved their own planning application so the site will go ahead.

The Planning Committee accepted that as a condition of this approval a number of conditions need to be applied, including on the number of vehicles that will travel through Little Milton and the times that they can enter the village. The wording was not defined in the meeting, but we are following up with SODC to push for a condition that

no waste vehicles, other than those serving the villages immediately adjacent to Little Milton, are allowed to pass through our village either on their way out in the morning or on their way back in the afternoon.

This is not the only avenue that is still open. There is still a possibility that the process followed to select this site - which is clearly in the wrong place to serve South Oxfordshire effectively and efficiently - could be challenged through Judicial Review. This will likely be a costly process so at this stage we are seeking any individuals who would be willing to support this financially. Please contact Francois van der Merwe if you would be willing to contribute.

Recreation Ground / Open Green Space

The sycamore tree at the rear of the village shop will be reduced in size on 5th November 2025. Winter bedding plants have been purchased for all the village planters.

Haseley Brook; the village does not meet the criteria for a S19 investigation (5 or more houses flooded). No decision has been made on the type of flood mitigation equipment to purchase with SODC grant funding.

Correspondence

Elsfield Residents Group has written to parish councils inviting them to a public meeting to stand together and demonstrate unity against the significant threat to rural communities posed by the Greater Oxford unitary option. It was agreed that Cllr van der Merwe will attend on behalf of the parish council.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on **Wednesday 12th November 2025** in Pine Lodge, commencing at 7.30pm.

<u>UPDATE FROM DISTRICT COUNCILLOR – GEORGINA HERITAGE</u> Joint Local Plan

Yesterday afternoon we received some incredibly disappointing news regarding South & Vale's Joint Local Plan submission. I'm afraid that if I try to express my own view on the matter it may result in a political rant entirely unsuitable for a monthly parish report. I hope to articulate my thoughts in a reasoned manner in due course, and we're still very much in the process of digesting this news and exploring the next steps. SODC has released the following statement:

A statement on behalf of South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils

Over the past four years, South and Vale have worked incredibly hard together to create an innovative, forward-looking and positive plan for housing and development in our areas that seeks to raise standards, actively address the need for genuinely affordable social housing and sustainable infrastructure, and to tackle the climate emergency and restore nature.

We've done this through widespread and extensive consultation and engagement with the thousands of stakeholders who have willingly and constructively engaged in the process, including members of the public, community representatives, partner organisations, neighbouring councils, the development industry and other businesses in the area.

We are therefore disheartened and very disappointed that the Planning Inspectors have recommended that we withdraw the plan from the examination process over a single issue - namely the "duty to co-operate", specifically with Oxford City Council. The city council itself was forced to withdraw its own local plan from examination earlier this year on several issues regarding the duty to co-operate.

It's no secret that there's disagreement within Oxfordshire on how many homes the rural districts should provide on Oxford's behalf. Nevertheless, all councils in Oxfordshire are working towards what they believe to be in the best interests of their residents and their area.

Cllr David Rouane, Leader of South Oxfordshire District Council, said: "We are disappointed but not surprised given recent rulings from Planning Inspectors nationally – an increasing number of emerging local plans around the country are being recommended for withdrawal for this issue in particular; Horsham and Mid Sussex spring to mind as recent examples.

"We developed a constructive and collaborative plan and engaged with the city through a variety of methods, even when there was clear disagreement over both the need and the approach. It is not clear what more we could have done on this front.

"Our approach to measuring housing need was in line with the Inspectors of Oxford's plan last year. Since our examination hearings in June, Oxford's latest local plan consultation shows that using the government's standard method there would be no more homes for us to find for Oxford.

"There are aspects of the Inspectors' letter that we're keen to review, but our most important role is to ensure where we can that we represent our communities and their needs."

The councils are in discussions about the next steps and will provide a further update in due course.

UPDATE FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR – JUDITH EDWARDS

Chalgrove Airfield Proposed Development

There's been a lot of discussion about the proposed housing development at Chalgrove airfield recently, so it felt useful to find out more about the current state of play. I asked for a briefing with OCC's planning team and also went with Freddie van Mierlo MP and Cllr David Turner (SODC, Chalgrove ward) to meet the leadership team at Martin-Baker to understand their perspective. My key takeaways from this learning are:

- The new SODC joint local plan should protect Chalgrove from a development of this size as Chalgrove is no longer in the plan, but unfortunately it is not yet in force. It is currently being examined by the Planning Inspector and confirmation of the plan is expected around December this year. Until the new plan is formally in place, the previous plan which did include Chalgrove is the most important policy which means that the site is vulnerable until that point.
- Martin-Baker Ltd. are clear that there is no viable alternative site for their operations, and they could not easily transfer the tests that they do elsewhere. The firm is crucial to the safety of air force jets around the world, and their systems have saved hundreds of lives over the years. They genuinely do not have a "Plan B" and are planning to fight not only the planning application but also any compulsory purchase order. Oxford Temporary Congestion Charge

The county council's scheme to tackle traffic problems in Oxford in the short-term is planned to start on Wednesday 29 October.

The temporary congestion charge will reduce traffic in the city during Network Rail's extended closure of Botley Road, making journeys quicker, more connected, more flexible and more reliable. When Botley Road reopens, the council will be able to introduce its traffic filter trial as planned.

Cars with a valid permit will be able to drive free of charge through all six congestion charge locations in Oxford. Residents are now able to <u>apply for permits</u> ahead of the launch of Oxfordshire County Council's temporary congestion charge in Oxford, using an online permit registration system.

LAST ORDERS – FINAL PINT

By the time this is read I will have celebrated my final service in the Benefice, 10 years and one week after I was licensed here as the Rector. There is a tradition that incoming parish priests ring a Church bell, if there is one, at their licensing service, with the number of tolls corresponding with the number of years they will be in post. It is not binding of course, but at St Mary's I consciously rang the Bell ten times, I always planned to be here ten years. If any of you go to the service welcoming my successor, whenever that will be, count the number of times the bells are rung!

I don't for a minute regret coming here, even though at times it has been very challenging. The first year was a very big adjustment, having left a single Church with several substantially larger congregations. Whilst of course I would love to see our churches filled and thriving, I have also grown to love the intimacy of this 'ministry in the small' - to know every person who worships and be able to administer communion by name has been a privilege. If a rare visitor comes along, I make it my business to find out their name. I have though, particularly enjoyed being a parish priest with a focus, and not simply on the Church.

The management of Church buildings has never been my first love, and I have been so grateful that that has largely been taken off my hands. I realise that they are precious, and I love the history they contain, and the centuries of prayer they have absorbed, but there is a constant danger that our buildings take priority over the people who use or visit them. I believe they should be signposts to something else, something that is not built in stone; they were never meant to be the final destination!

There have been high points and low points. Getting the latter out of the way first, most will be aware that I had to take a few months off a few years ago, the result of an accumulation of circumstances. Oddly, one of the high points was in fact during Covid, when we were not able to be in our buildings at all. It was an extraordinary experience, from the first fumbling days we tried it, to welcome so many people to our zoom services, all conducted from my study desk. Who among those who came will ever forget the Shepherd yodelling for her sheep (*My sheep hear my voice, and I know them and they follow me*, John 10, 27-28). You had to be there!

There is so much else to say, but I will end simply with a huge thankyou to you all, from Cath and me, for your friendship, your acceptance and your love. We look forward to a new phase of our lives, but leaving this one will not be easy.

FRIENDS OF WELLS FARM

Autumn is a time for wonderful colours as the trees remove the chlorophyl. This chemical absorbs the blues and reds from the sunlight spectrum but reflects the green which is why they look that colour in the summer. Now there is much less sunlight and the temperatures are dropping, the trees prepare for winter, the chlorophyl breaks down revealing the reds and yellows. The reds are especially vivid when there are periods of bright sunshine and cold nights, so look out for the change in intensity before they fall.

If they have not already arrived, we are likely to have some dexter cattle back at Wells. There will be four of them who will probably go into Poplar field (the one with the big tree). Dogs on leads please. More sheep will arrive as winter gets going but the dry summer has meant a poor hay harvest and some of our fields have very little to nibble on.

The hedgerows are full of berries and these are food for many animals overwintering here. As the weather freezes in Eastern Europe, migrants come to feast on the bounty. Look out for the Fieldfares and Redwings. Fieldfares have a distinctive "chat chat chat" call as they fly over, to help you tell the difference!

VIEW FROM VIEWS

Unbelievable after a long hot, dry summer, with little growth in tilled crops, the weather took a change after these crops had been harvested, and we witnessed a little rain. This just gave enough moisture in the ground to allow early planted catch crops to make an attempt to grow, these are crops we grow to give us ground cover between crops to help sequester carbon. The later planted catch crops showed no signs of growth until a bit of rain just about 2 weeks before we wanted to plant the next crop hy! ho! That's life!. But miracles do happen sometimes as once we decided we had waited long enough for some soil moisture; we planted on the Tuesday Rolled on the Wednesday, just to press the seed onto any moisture there might have been, then that night right on cue we had substantial rain just what was needed. All the soil we have cultivated this autumn has worked beautifully this Autumn and growing conditions could not be better so after a long and arduous summer things might be coming back to something like normal, and by the time this is read perhaps we may have finished all our autumn planting.

This really has been an odd year I mention above all tilled crops but no mention of top fruit, of which I know little, the abundance of fruit has been unbelievable, with very variable keeping qualities. I can only believe that the conditions were right when the fruit first formed with no frost in the late spring, plus these plants/trees/or bushes are well established and have a large root system enabling them to withstand long periods of drought. Some trees I guess will suffer but these will mainly be ones that have been recently planted or transplanted on which we have quite an area, of course this remains to be seen.

The farmers that will really suffer this year will be the livestock producers mainly the Cattle and Sheep as the grass they rely on will be in extremely short supply, and thus expensive, at the moment livestock farmers will be experiencing late summer growth which at the moment is extraordinary, unfortunately this late grass is mainly water with little nutrient value. This lack of feed will mean they will have to turn to cereals to get the nutrients they need which should giving us Arable farmers a bit of a lift. Needless to say, this will not be the case as our wonderful Government did a trade deal to the benefit of the USA not UK, as all that has happened to cereal prices is that they are falling out of bed. To add insult to injury the Dairy companies have made a substantial reduction in the retail price of milk, due to over production or lack of demand, it seems we cannot win at the moment.

On the wildlife front the Swallows have flown to their winter quarters, and we await the arrival of Field Fares and other winter visitors. I have to mention at this stage that one of our endangered farmland birds, the Grey Partridge, have had a good breading season, I can only think this is because being ground nesting the dry has suited them. I also think

we are getting to understand more about their preferred habitat, to have coveys of over 10, with some of 15, is quite exceptional. A distressing fact was pointed out to me the other day that a Buzzard had tried to take a half-grown Hare not a baby leveret, we have been led to believe these raptors, like the Red Kites will only take carrion (dead not live) any animal that is hungry will I maintain take any food it can, so much for the experts. That may be a little hard as I think Buzzards would be more inclined towards live prey on the whole.

This of course is why we should question the pressure by the vocal minority that we should be introducing species that have not been on our shores for hundreds of years. A case in point, the Hare population has diminished since we came to the Views some 50 years ago, is this due to the reintroduction of the Red Kite in the 90"s, of course modern agriculture will have contributed to this as well.

I am sorry if some readers felt my last month's comments were a little out of order, all I can say is that there is in this country what is known, believe it or not, as freedom of speech. I am just sorry that the comments were made to Newsletter editor rather than me, as I believe I have that I have read that "any views made in this publication are not those of the Parish Council or the Editor". The trouble is that there are those of us who have been around a long time have seen so often gross errors in Government policy costing us the taxpayer a fortune in many cases and, just laugh it off, just think of HS2, planning laws made to save the environment modified to suit the government policy, water companies allowed to fleece the country, to name but a few, I could go on, do we just sit back and say nothing? There are those of us who have had to earn a living the hard way, see the country ruled by those who, can only do things by the book to satisfy the vocal minority.

Bees in Winter


Heading into the cold winter months, we need to be even more considerate to our local bees than usual. In winter, honeybee queens remain in their hives with the exception of particularly sunny days. Bumblebee queens may also emerge from hibernation if prompted to by mild weather. Solitary bees will leave their nests once ready to mate. When bees do emerge during winter, they need to have access to nectar, or they risk dying of starvation. In order to help these pollinators survive the winter, we recommend you plant winter bloomers in your garden. These include single flowered Hellebores (the open face gives great access to pollen and nectar!), Crocuses (make sure to plant them in an area with lots of light so they fully open), Snowdrops and Aconites. Ivy also works well as a late nectar source as well as shelter from any harsh conditions. If gardening isn't your thing, you can make natural spaces bee friendly by creating twig and leaf piles (which can be as easy as not raking your garden when fallen leaves drop!) and caring for wayward queen bumblebees by either carefully relocating them to flowers or offering her a 1:1 sugar and water solution.

Tips for looking after our hedgehogs this winter

- Always move your burn piles before you light them as hedgehogs and frogs often use them to sleep in. This is, after-all, how hedgehogs were once upon a time cooked to be eaten! Thankfully it is now illegal to eat this endangered species.
- If you find a sick or injured hedgehog, or one that's up and about during the middle of the day, call either Oxfordshire Wildlife Rescue centre on <u>07549322464</u> or <u>Tiggywinkle's wildlife hospital on <u>01844 292292</u>.
 </u>
- Leave some areas untouched! Messy log piles, long grass and fallen leaves are great for hibernating hedgehogs. Please leave a wild area in your garden so our hedgehogs can hibernate in peace nice and cosy and safe.
- Put out a shallow dish of water or make sure your ponds are easy to get out of for hedgehogs, so they have water to drink. Sometimes hedgehogs come out of hibernation to eat and drink, especially in warmer weather, so even at this time of year, putting out water can help.
- Avoid using pesticides or herbicides as this will make hedgehogs very ill. Find out more at www.hedgehogrescue.org.uk
